



QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

Pai Gow Gow poker is played with a 53-card deck including a joker. The game is played in a one-on-one style, players against the dealer. The object is to make the best possible poker hands.

The game begins by placing a wager in the proper betting circle. Each player—as well as the dealer—receives seven cards face-down. A random number generator will determine which player receives the first seven cards. Once all hands have been dealt, each player looks at and sets their hand. The goal is to create the highest five-card poker hand and the next highest two-card hand. When ready, players place their cards face-down in the appropriate boxes on the table. The joker can be used to complete a straight, flush or straight flush. Otherwise, it is counted as an ace. Remember: the five-card hand must be your higher hand. If you need assistance in setting your hand, just ask your dealer.

Once all players have placed their hands face-down, the dealer reveals and sets his hand. Players hands are turned face up by the dealer and compared to the dealer hand. You are a winner when both your five-card and two-card hands beat the dealer. If there is a split, win-one-lose-one, it is considered a push: no one wins.

A 5% commission is charged for every winning wager.

RANK OF HAND (HIGHEST TO LOWEST)

- 5 aces
- Royal flush
- Straight flush
- 4 of a kind
- Full house
- Flush
- Straight*
- 3 of a kind
- Two pair
- One pair
- High card

* A-2-3-4-5 is the second highest straight.
